There is simple installation. Windows are sized to the opening providing easy installation and quoting. There are removable interior covers that allow installation through pre-drilled holes in the jamb and provides a clean, finished appearance. Adjustable hinges allow fine-tuned installation. The frame bevels are available in 0, 8 and 14 degrees.

The Ultimate Replacement Casement has the most durable hardware system on the market today. That is because of a revolutionary wash mode system that allows the entire window to be washed from inside the home. Sash opens very close to the jamb providing unobstructed views. Ability to meet egress codes at smaller sizes. Its' hardware eliminates sash drag and hard to close products.

It has sizing options available as large as 40" wide and as tall as 96". It meets commercial DP 50 up to 40" x 92". The One-lite low E II with argon insulating glass provides maximum energy efficiency.

## Helpful Hints

Now that Fall is here and Winter is near, here are some helpful hints on what you should be doing to get ready ....

1. Inspect the exterior of your windows to make sure all the caulking is good. If not, you will want to fix it so there are no leaks.
2. Make sure there is no broken or cracked glass, if there is, you will want to get the glass replaced and if you end up having to replace the whole window make sure that you prime and paint any exposed wood.
3. Check the weather stripping around your doors. Make sure there are no missing or cracked pieces because the cold air could leak through it. You can just bring in a piece of your weather stripping and we can get some ordered for you if we don't have it in stock.
4. If your home has a basement, consider protecting its window wells by covering them with plastic shields.
5. Switch out Summer screens with glass replacements from storage. If you have Storm windows, install them.
